



## Nominating for the *Australia 2020* Summit

The Prime Minister of Australia Kevin Rudd will convene an *Australia 2020* Summit for 1000 Australians at the National Parliament on 19 and 20 April 2008. The Summit will bring together some of the best and brightest brains to tackle the long term challenges confronting Australia's future.

Every Australian has the opportunity to nominate to attend this Summit as a member of one the following 10 critical areas of discussion.

1. Future directions for the Australian economy – including education, skills, training, science and innovation as part of the nation's productivity agenda
2. Economic infrastructure, the digital economy and the future of our cities
3. Population, sustainability, climate change and water
4. Future directions for rural industries and rural communities
5. A long-term national health strategy – including the challenges of preventative health, workforce planning and the ageing population
6. Strengthening communities, supporting families and social inclusion
7. Options for the future of indigenous Australia
8. Towards a creative Australia: the future of the arts, film and design
9. The future of Australian governance: renewed democracy, a more open government (including the role of the media), the structure of the Federation and the rights and responsibilities of citizens
10. Australia's future security and prosperity in a rapidly changing region and world.

Participants will be selected by a 10 member independent non-government Steering Committee. Expenses need to be covered by each individual. Special circumstances applications will be considered.

**SUPPORTING STATEMENT**

During 2007 I have been the research arm for an independent team looking at the issues surrounding indigenous housing management. The team consisting of an Indigenous Housing Corporation CEO, Risk Managers, Process Analyst and Software Developers have met together for over 12 months. We have also had regular contact with the WA Department of Housing, and in particular have analysed their costing for KPI's identified in their tender documents. There has also been consultation with WA ministers and Members of Parliament.

Our team has had the ability to think globally on the issues that have been identified.

Starting with a service provider based in Broome, WA, we have been able to design a management solution that can be rolled out across all indigenous housing service providers, at the same time providing the statistical information to state and federal governments on an As Is basis. Using unique software we have successfully conducted pilot tests on a crucial part of the solution and have completed SDLC documentation up to the Business Requirements document.

In addition to this solution we have planned how savings can be made nationally in the areas of Procurement and Risk Management and National Planning.

We have several publications available to give background to the EMS and have sent copies to relevant Federal and State Ministers.

### ***Options for the future of Indigenous Australia***

The Australian Government is committed to closing the gap between Indigenous and non-Indigenous Australia. This includes the gap in literacy, numeracy, infant mortality, health outcomes and overall life expectancy.

The Government is also committed to working with Indigenous Australians to ensure they are able fully to participate - both socially and economically - in the life of the nation. This includes providing access to high quality education, health services generally and addressing alcohol, violence and homelessness in those communities where these threatens the safety and wellbeing of individuals and families.

The Australia 2020 Summit will examine:

- How we forge a new partnership with between Indigenous and non-Indigenous Australia to overcome disadvantage and provide practical pathways to the future
- The role of targeted programs and interventions such as the Northern Territory Intervention and the Cape York Welfare Reform Trials in achieving change in remote communities
- How we might promote economic development in remote Australia to provide Indigenous community members with the opportunity to be economically independent
- Improving access to mainstream programs by Indigenous Australians
- Promoting and preserving Indigenous culture, languages and traditions.

### ***Economic Infrastructure, the digital economy and the future of our cities***

The Australia Government is committed to building world class infrastructure to improve the competitiveness of our businesses and quality of life in Australia's cities and regions. Our priorities for advanced infrastructure include modern, safe and efficient freight and passenger transport networks, a high speed National Broadband Network, and reliable water and energy infrastructure. World class broadband infrastructure alone could add \$20 billion to the Australian economy each year according to some estimates. The Australian Government is committed to practical measures aimed at helping families cope with the collision of work and family life. The Government is also committed to examining new possibilities in partnership with the community, church and charitable sector.
